PAID LEGAL (ISRAEL BAR) INTERNSHIP FOR OLIM

The Ministry of Justice's Office of the Deputy Attorney General (International Law) handles a broad range of issues in the field of international law, including public international law, economic law and international humanitarian law. The Office is also at the forefront of advocating for Israel in various international forums, and is responsible for overseeing legal proceedings against Israel and its officials in foreign jurisdictions.

Each year, the Office selects one or two foreign-trained, new immigrant, lawyers to fill the position of "Oleh Intern" (מתמחה עולה). Our 12-month paid internship program is targeted towards foreign-trained Oleh lawyers seeking to satisfy their internship requirement for admission to the Israeli Bar. Our program affords Oleh Interns the unique opportunity to complete their internship requirement while working on some of the most fascinating and pressing issues facing Israel in the international arena.

QUALIFICATIONS:

To qualify for the position the candidate must:

- have made Aliyah not more than ten years prior to the internship start date;
- have completed a degree in law; and
- possess competency in English at a mother-tongue level.

The following attributes are advantageous:

- ability to understand Hebrew well;
- at least two years of experience in the practice of law;
- background in public international law; and
- practical litigation experience.
